## American Psychological Association

Here are some examples of the APA Formatting style. Keep in mind that there are many more formats available at <http://owl.english.purdue.edu/owl/resource/560/01>

### **Format for Citing a Book With One Author**

Author, A. A. (Year of publication). *Title of work*. Location: Publisher.

Example:

Brinkly, D. (2006). *The Great Deluge*. New York: Morrow.

### **Format for Citing a Book With An Editor**

Last name, First name (Eds.) (Year of publication). *Title of work*. Location: Publisher.

Example:

Duncan, G. J., & Brooks-Gunn, J. (Eds.). (1997). *Consequences of growing up poor*. New York: Russell Sage Foundation.

### **Format for Citing a Paginated Journal**

Paginated journals start from page one in every issue. As a result, the issue number is indicated in parentheses after the volume.

Example:

Scruton, R. (1996). The eclipse of listening. *The New Criterion*, 15(30), 5-13.

### **Format for Citing a Magazine**

As per the APA general format.

Example:

Henry, W. A., III. (1990, April 9). Making the grade in today's schools. *Time*, 135, 28-31.

### **Format for Citing a Magazine from an Online Database**

Author, A. A., & Author, B. B. (Date of publication). Title of article. *Title of Online Periodical*, volume number (issue number if available). Retrieved month day, year, (if necessary) from <http://www.someaddress.com/full/url/>

### **Format for Citing a Webpage**

Author, A. A., & Author, B. B. (Date of publication). *Title of document*. Retrieved from <http://Web address>

Example:

MacLennan, Darren. (2009). *Review of Wraeththu*. Retrieved from <http://www.rpg.net/reviews/>
