

# McNeese State University Transfer Admission Standards

## Effective

### Fall 2012 18 or more college-level academic hours earned

- Cumulative GPA 2.0 or better
- Successful completion of a college-level English and a college-level mathematics course designed to fulfill general education requirements
- Eligible to return to last institution attended

### Less than 18 hours college-level academic hours earned

- Cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better
- Meet all other admission standards for first-time freshmen

## *Steps to transferring to McNeese State University:*

1. Submit application for admission and \$20 non-refundable application fee. List all institutions previously attended regardless of whether credit was earned or is desired.
2. Submit official college transcripts. A transcript from each college or university attended must be sent directly to Admissions. An incomplete transcript may be used to make an admission decision for currently enrolled students, but a complete transcript must be sent to McNeese once final grades are posted at the transfer institution.
3. Submit the proof of immunization form.
4. Submit copy of draft card (males ages 18-25 only).
5. Apply for scholarships.
6. Apply for financial aid.

# Sowela to McNeese Transferable Courses

## Steps to enrolling at Sowela Technical Community College:

1. Complete application for admission (available at [www.sowela.edu](http://www.sowela.edu)).
2. Submit immunization form (available at [www.sowela.edu](http://www.sowela.edu)).
3. Submit copy of driver's license and social security card. (Nursing students only.)
4. Submit copy of selective service card (males 18-25 years old).
5. Submit official high school transcript in a sealed envelope or official copy of GED scores. (High school transcript needed only if you graduated before 2004 or did not graduate from a Louisiana high school.)
6. Have official transcripts mailed (or hand delivered in a sealed envelope) from all previously attended universities or colleges.
7. Complete testing requirements:
  - Submit official ACT scores (scores cannot be more than five years old) or
  - Schedule to take the COMPASS placement test.
8. Apply for financial aid.
9. Schedule a new student orientation.

The Sowela courses will transfer to McNeese; however, they will not be included in the number of upper division courses required for a degree at McNeese.
